The Brazilian Delegation presents its compliments to the Director General of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade and has the honour to transmit the enclosed statement of offers whereby the Brazilian Government declares its intention to contribute to the objectives of the Kennedy Round of Trade Negotiations in terms of the Principles laid down in the Ministerial Resolution of May 21 1963, and of the Conclusions embodied in the Ministerial Resolution of May 6 1964, taking also into account the relevant provisions of Part IV of the General Agreement regarding the participation of less developed countries in trade negotiations.

2. As it will be noted, the Brazilian Government also agrees to study, with other less developed countries so willing, measures designed to expand trade among themselves as part of the contribution to the overall objectives of the Kennedy Round of Trade Negotiations.

STATEMENT OF THE CONTRIBUTION WHICH THE  
BRAZILIAN GOVERNMENT INTENDS TO MAKE TO  
THE OBJECTIVES OF THE KENNEDY ROUND OF  
TRADE NEGOTIATIONS

The Brazilian Government declares its intention to contribute to the objectives of the Kennedy Round of Trade Negotiations in terms of the Principles laid down in (a) the Ministerial Resolution of May 21 1963, (b) the Conclusions embodied in the Ministerial Resolution of May 6 1964, and (c) the relevant provisions of Part IV of the General Agreement regarding the participation of less-developed countries in trade negotiations. It is therefore the understanding of the Brazilian Government that the offers it will put forth are subject to the principle of relative reciprocity.

2. At the present stage of the negotiations, the Brazilian Government indicates the general outline of its offers, and reserves the right to give full details of same when the offers of all developed countries participating in the agricultural negotiations of the Kennedy Round are made known. This position is a result of Brazil's preponderant interest in these agricultural offers, and the subsequent need to know them before the full scope of its contributions to the negotiations can be adequately estimated.

3. Accordingly, the Brazilian Government lists herein the major fields in which it is carefully studying the possibilities of making concrete offers subject to the offers

offers made by other participating countries, especially developed countries, in both industrial and agricultural sections of the present trade negotiations, in the light of Brazil's economic development and trade needs:

A: ADMINISTRATIVE FIELD

The Brazilian Government is studying the simplification and elimination, wherever possible, of bureaucratic and administrative measures related to international trade.

B: FISCAL FIELD

The Brazilian Government is taking the necessary steps to review its system of consular formalities and fees, in order to facilitate trade.


C: EXCHANGE FIELD

The Brazilian Government is studying certain aspects of its exchange practices in order to make them consistent with the principles of IMF, having due account of the legitimate requirements of the Brazilian economic development.

4. As stated above, specific details of the offers will be brought to the attention of participating countries at an opportune moment in the future. These offers, as indicated, are of a conditional nature, and may be withdrawn if the Brazilian Government should consider the results of the negotiations unsatisfactory.

5. Finally, the Brazilian Governments also agree to study, with other less developed countries so willing, measures designed to expand trade between themselves as part of the contribution to the objectives of the Kennedy Round Trade Negotiations.

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## SUPPLEMENTARY STATEMENT OF OFFERS

The Brazilian Government, in accordance with the previous statement on its contribution to the Kennedy Round of Trade Negotiations, has taken the following measures, which came into effect on 13 November 1965, and should be considered as part of Brazil's contribution to the objectives of the Negotiations:

- (a) elimination of the previous deposits and financial charges on imports;
- (b) elimination of the previous deposits on financial transfers;
- (c) reduction from 30% to 15% of the financial charges on financial transfers and, in the case of enterprises that undertake to co-operate in stabilizing prices, reduction from 30% to 10%, the existing exemptions system being maintained.

2. In addition, Brazil has also eliminated the exchange rate differential ("deságio") on bilateral agreements conventional currencies.

3. The Brazilian Government wishes to stress the importance of these measures which represent a considerable liberalization in the exchange field, and are intended to favour an increase in trade in the spirit of the Kennedy Round of Trade Negotiations.

KENNEDY ROUND OF TRADE NEGOTIATIONS

SUPPLEMENTARY STATEMENT OF OFFERS BY BRAZIL

The Brazilian Government, in addition to its previous statements on its contribution to the Kennedy Round of Trade Negotiations and in accordance with its policy of trade liberalization, has decided to reduce the number of products classified in the special category of imports, that is, imports which are subject to global exchange quotas. Accordingly, and as a first step towards the implementation of that policy, the Customs Policy Council has transferred 422 itens and sub-itens to the general category of imports, that is, imports which are free from exchange restrictions. The attached document entitled "Resolution Nº 404" contains all the itens and sub-itens affected by this measure.

The Brazilian Government wishes to stress the importance of such a policy in favour of the increase of trade in the spirit of the Kennedy Round of Trade Negotiations, and requests that the measure mentioned above be considered as part of Brazil's contribution to the objectives of the said negotiations.

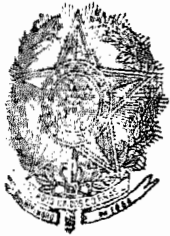

SUPPLEMENTARY STATEMENT OF OFFERS BY BRAZIL

The Brazilian Government, in addition to its previous statements on its contribution to the Kennedy Round of Trade Negotiations and in accordance with its policy of trade liberalization, has proceeded on reducing the number of products classified in the special category of imports, that is, imports which are subject to global exchange quotas. Accordingly, and in pursuance of that policy, the Customs Policy Council has further transferred 166 itens and sub-itens to the general category of imports, that is, imports which are free from exchange restrictions. The attached document entitled "Resolution No. 414" (already translated into English for GATT convenience) contains all the itens and sub-itens affected by this measure.

The Brazilian Government wishes once again to stress the importance of such a policy in favour of the increase of trade in the spirit of the Kennedy Round of Trade Negotiations, and requests that the measure mentioned above be considered as part of Brazil's contribution to the objectives of the said negotiations.





The Brazilian Government, in addition to its previous statements on its contribution to the Kennedy Round of Trade Negotiations and in accordance with its policy of trade liberalization, has proceeded on reducing the number of products classified in the special category of imports, that is, imports which are subject to global exchange quotas. Accordingly, and in pursuance of that policy, the Customs Policy Council has further transferred 234 itens and sub-itens to the general category of imports, that is, imports which are free from exchange restrictions. The attached documents entitled "Resolution No. 417" and "Resolution No. 425" (both already translated into English for GATT convenience) contain all the itens and sub-itens affected by this measure.

2. The Brazilian Government wishes once again to stress the importance of such a policy in favour of the increase of trade in the spirit of the Kennedy Round of Trade Negotiations, and requests that the measure mentioned above be considered as part of Brazil's contribution to the objectives of the said negotiations.


In effect, Article 56, of Law No. 5.025/1966, reads as follows:



The CONTRACTING PARTIES to the General Agreement have already been informed of the deep and extensive reforms recently carried on by the Brazilian Government in order to liberalize and rationalize its foreign trade mechanisms. Those reforms which, among other consequences, resulted in the complete dismantling of non-tariff restrictions and considerable reduction of the rates of duty of the Brazilian Customs Tariff, constitute, without any doubt, significant contribution to the expansion of the international trade, - main objective of the Kennedy Round of Trade Negotiations.

2. I do not think it fit to repeat here those measures. It suffices to enunciate the GATT documentation which records them. Indeed, at the time of the Brazilian request of waiver of certain obligations under Article II of the General Agreement, the Brazilian Delegation had the opportunity to



3. Besides, on the 28th February 1967, the Brazilian Government decided to make a linear cut of 20% on the rates of duty of the Brazilian Customs Tariff. As a result of the tariff reform, referred to above, and of this linear cut, the maximum rates of duty, for instance, have been reduced from 150% to 100%:

4. If one takes into account the present stage of Brazil's economic development and the offers tabled up to this moment by other countries participating in the Kennedy Round, one has to recognize that those measures, taken unilaterally, more than compensate for the concessions which may moderately benefit some of the Brazilian export products.

5. In order to comply with some legal aspects involved in these negotiations, the Brazilian Government, in a new and positive effort, tables the specific tariff offers recorded in the attached list. I wish to make it clear that these offers are contingent upon Brazil's securing in return concessions of value to its export trade in the markets of other participating countries.
