Sir,

On the instructions of my Government, I have the honour to notify the intention of the Government of Trinidad and Tobago to participate in the Kennedy Round of Trade Negotiations.

Trinidad and Tobago has a very small internal 2. market and is heavily dependent on exports and imports; a substantial part of our trade has developed on a system of Commonwealth preferences the sudden removal or reduction of which will have severe economic and social repercussions in the country. Nevertheless, in view of the Ministerial Resolution of 6 May 1964, particularly the provisions of Section D which inter alia provide that developed countries cannot expect to receive reciprocity from the less-developed countries and that the contribution of the latter to the overall objective of trade liberalization should be considered in the light of their development needs; and taking into consideration the similar principles contained in the new Part IV of the Agreement, the Government of Trinidad and Tobago declares its intention to contribute to the attainment of the objectives of the Trade Negotiations to the fullest extent possible within the limits imposed by its development needs.

3. The Government of Trinidad and Tobago is prepared to make concrete offers after having had an opportunity to study the offers of the developed countries participating in the industrial and agricultural negotiations. The headings under which possible offers are being studied are:

> (a) administrative: the simplification or elimination, wherever possible, of administrative measures or practices which are held to present avoidable obstacles to imports into Trinidad and Tobago;

(b) Preferences: to consider the ways in which modification of the existing preferential arrangements to which Trinidad and Tobago is a party could be attempted;

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(c) Trade expansion: to consider entering into negotiations with other less developed countries with a view to increasing trade between lessdeveloped countries as envisaged in Part IV of the Agreement (Article XXXVII(4)).

Sir,

In a letter dated 4 April 1966, I had the honour to inform you that the Government of Trinidad and Tobago intended to participate in the Kennedy Round of Trade Negotiations on the basis of the provisions in the ministerial resolution of 6 May 1964 and Part IV of the General Agreement and which provide, among other things, that developed countries cannot expect to receive reciprocity from the less developed countries and that the contributions of the latter to the overall objective of trade liberalization should be considered in the light of their development needs. I also indicated that it was the intention of my Government to make concrete offers after having had an opportunity to study those of the developed countries under three stated headings. I wish to use this opportunity to reiterate my Government's preparedness to take concrete action in accordance with those commitments.

My Government has already notified its intention to participate in the negotiations among the less developed countries with a view to increasing our trade with other less developed countries (my letter dated 16 August, 1966 refers), thereby fulfilling one of the important objectives of the Kennedy Round.

In addition to the foregoing, I am instructed by my Government to table the attached list of positive offers. These offers are made on the most favoured nation basis, in full knowledge of probable detrimental effects on our national revenue position and economic development, and on the condition that benefits commensurate with the extent of the sacrifice which we are prepared to make will be received in return.

# SECRET

Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that the Government of Trinidad and Tobago, having received document TN. 64/82, has taken note of your suggestion "that 30 November be taken as the date upon which delegations should communicate to each other their assessment of the negotiating position, together with an indication of the modifications in their initial negotiating positions which would be necessary unless the specific desiderata which have emerged during the course of the bilateral negotiations are satisfied."

The Government of Trinidad and Tobago shares your view as to the desirability of participants communicating their assessments and consequential modifications of initial negotiating positions in a manner designed to facilitate comparisons.

The Government of Trinidad and Tobago would have liked to be able to express its position along the lines you suggested. However, for reasons beyond its control, it was unable to do so by 30 November. Furthermore, it sees no likelihood of being in a position to do so before it has had an opportunity to examine the assessments and consequential modifications of initial negotiating positions communicated by participating Contracting Parties.

Therefore, the Government of Trinidad and Tobago wishes to inform you and participants in the Kennedy Round that the statement of contribution of April 1966 and specific tariff offers on agricultural and industrial products of September 1966 are being maintained unchanged for the present. Whilst Trinidad and Tobago's desire to make a maximum contribution to the liberalization of trade has lost none of its force, nevertheless, in view of the serious problems common to all developing countries which it faces, the possibility that the initial offer might have to be

modified and reduced cannot be excluded.

The Government of Trinidad and Tobago attaches great importance to the emphasis which has been placed throughout the negotiations on achieving the maximum result in the direction of easing the trading problems of the less-developed countries and trusts that its position and that of other participating less-developed Contracting Parties will not worsen as a result of withdrawals by developed Contracting Parties and/or of inadequate participation of less-developed Contracting Parties.
