The CR-building is the modern building next to the WTO's main entrance. It holds the CR Room. After the opening day, the CR Room will be split into rooms CR I and II.

The WTO's main building holds meeting rooms A, D, E, and W. Rooms A and W are located on the ground floor; Rooms D and E are on the third floor and can be reached by elevator or stairs.


