- Recent study on WTO effectiveness is critical of the existing literature (Chaudoin, Hays and Hicks, 2014):
  - Do we really know that the WTO cures cancer?
  - Membership in CITES and WTO equally promote trade
- More interdisciplinary micro-evidence is needed



- Boffa and Olarreaga (2012) find no evidence of tit-for-tat games
- Rather evidence of chicken games among WTO players....
- But the same is true for non-WTO members during the crisis
- Can we attribute the absence of escalation in protectionism to the WTO?

Future VVTRs

- Report identifies topics for a negotiating agenda
  - Trade and the environment: is XX(b) all the WTO can offer?
  - Trade and labor standards: should we leave these to RTAs?
  - Trade and income inequality: shall we ignore it?
- WTO members need to tackle big issues
- Maybe the mistake of the past was to focus on low-hanging fruits....



# Share of exporters online and offline


