The purpose of the Newsletter<sup>1</sup> is to provide Acceding Governments with a summary report of the meetings of the Informal Group on Accessions and to assist them with preparations for meetings and negotiations associated with their accessions. It is one of several practical steps by the WTO Secretariat to ensure transparency on accessions matters. This document has been prepared under the Secretariat's own responsibility and without prejudice to the positions of Members and to their rights and obligations under the WTO.

## NEWSLETTER FOR ACCEDING GOVERNMENTS

The second meeting of the Informal Group on Accessions in 2012 took place today, 21 February 2012. At today's meeting, the Secretariat consulted with Members on the Evolving Calendar of Accessions Meetings for 2012<sup>2</sup>. Twenty-one delegations attended the meeting, including the Ambassadors of Panama and Saudi Arabia. It was positively noted that these IGA meetings are becoming more interactive.

The Secretariat briefed the IGA on: (i) the four 2012 Accession Priorities (Kazakhstan, Lao PDR (LDC), Serbia, and Yemen (LDC)); and (ii) the progress in seven active accession processes (Afghanistan; Algeria; Azerbaijan; Belarus; Ethiopia; Seychelles; and, Tajikistan).

The Director of the Accessions Division (Mr. Chiedu Osakwe) conveyed to Members appreciation for Members' support for the four 2012 Accession Priorities. He reiterated that progress and harvest would depend on: (i) the timely and substantive submission of technical inputs by acceding governments; and (ii) the early conclusion of pending bilateral negotiations. He therefore urged Members to intensify their efforts to close all pending bilateral negotiations by mid-March, and no later, to ensure that the Secretariat team could prepare the Consolidated Goods Schedules for Goods and Services before the Summer break. This timeline would give Members the required time to review the Schedules to convene relevant verification meetings after the Summer break, in September/October. In reporting on the 2012 Accession Priorities, to remain on track, the pace of input submissions from Kazakhstan required acceleration. The outstanding bilateral negotiation(s) with Yemen and Lao PDR required completion, no later than mid-March. Serbia would need to submit its updated Legislative Action Plan and relevant Members would need to increase the pace of bilateral negotiations with Serbia. With regard to the two LDC Accession Priorities, namely, Lao PDR and Yemen, the Ambassador of Saudi Arabia, on behalf of the Arab Group, and Jordan urged Members to conclude the pending bilateral market access negotiations.

The IGA was also informed that pursuant to paragraph 31 (f) of the recommendations adopted by the General Council in November 2011, the distribution of official documents in meeting rooms and at the Document Centre had been discontinued as of 1 January 2012. Accession-related documents would need to be retrieved from the Members' website.
