IGA-AGENDA:

The 5th meeting of the Informal Group on Accessions (IGA) in 2013 took place today, 30 May. It was chaired by Mr Chiedu Osakwe, Director of the Accessions Division. The IGA was briefed on: (i) the overall picture on accessions pace of work and timelines for MC9; (ii) LDCs' Accessions, including those for MC9 and LDCs Consultative Group meeting; (iii) 2013 accession WP focus; (iv) accession WP maintenance work; and, (v) outreach and technical assistance. The IGA also bade farewell to Mr Michael Wei, current Deputy Representative at the Mission of Chinese Taipei, and thanked him for his contributions to WTO Accessions. The WTO Secretariat consulted Members on the Evolving Calendar of Accessions Meetings for 2013 (annexed).

LDCs ACCESSIONS AND CONSULTATIVE GROUP MEETING

The IGA was briefed on the LDCs Consultative Group meeting that took place on 22 May at the Heads of Delegation level. The meeting was chaired by Nepal and attended by Ambassador Steffen Smidt, Facilitator of LDCs Deliverables for MC9 and Chairman LDCs' Sub Committee. The deposited Accession Packages of Article XII LDC Members and LDCs' vital role were highlighted as strengthening and safeguarding the WTO rules-based system. Yemen and Afghanistan were two LDC accessions basically on track for a 2013 completion. LDCs commended the results on accessions and thanked Members and the Secretariat for their continued support.

2013 ACCESSION WP FOCUS

<u>Afghanistan:</u> Kabul was dedicated to a 2013 accession completion. The delegation of Afghanistan met with the Chairman of the General Council on 4 May to confirm Afghanistan's commitment to conclude its accession at the 9th Ministerial Conference in Bali, Indonesia. The Afghan negotiating team remained committed to concluding all bilateral market negotiations before the 4th Working Party Meeting, scheduled for July. The Afghan team, assisted by Members and working with the Secretariat on a weekly basis, was currently updating the Draft Working Party Report.

<u>Yemen:</u> The Draft Accession Package was ready *de facto*, subject only to the conclusion of legislation-based domestic processes in Ukraine regarding its bilateral negotiations with Yemen.

<u>Bosnia and Herzegovina</u>: This accession was on track. The Agriculture Plurilateral Meeting and the 12th Working Party Meeting were scheduled for 6 June. The visit to Sarajevo, by the WP Chairman and the Secretariat team, was scheduled for the 26 May. On Bilateral Market Access negotiations, the negotiating team was working closely with Members to conclude the remaining negotiations.

<u>Kazakhstan</u>: The next cycle of meetings would take place in the week of 3 June. Trilateral consultations on adjustment (Kazakhstan + Russian Federation + Member X) were underway. Astana was reviewing the draft Services Schedule consolidated by the WTO Secretariat. A verification meeting would be convened in June once the review was concluded. Another cycle of meetings was envisaged for July to take stock.

<u>Serbia:</u> Belgrade has submitted an updated Legislative Action Plan based on the new format. Other relevant legislative inputs were still pending.

Sevchelles: Sevchelles had submitted a massive amount of technical inputs for its next cycle of meetings. Only updated Agriculture Supporting Tables (AGSTs) were outstanding. Victoria was working round the clock with Working Party Members. The Secretariat has prepared the Elements of the Draft Working Party Report. Draft specific commitment paragraphs have been prepared by Victoria and circulated for Members' review. A revised Legislative Action Plan and associated technical inputs have been circulated. Seychelles was committed to concluding as many Bilateral Market Access negotiations as possible by the next cycle of meetings, scheduled for 21 June. Its target was to work for the emergence of its Draft Accession Package as soon as possible.




Informal Group on Accessions, Geneva, 30 May 2013

MAINTENANCE WORK

The IGA was briefed on the progress in 4 other active accessions (Algeria; Azerbaijan; Belarus; and The Bahamas). On Algeria, a negotiating

team from Algiers was in Geneva from 21 to 23 May for Bilateral Market Access negotiations with Members. Algiers has submitted revised AGSTs. On Azerbaijan, a negotiating team will be in Geneva from 3 to 7 June for bilateral meetings with Members. On Belarus, an Informal Consultations of the Working Party took place on 16 May. The submission of relevant inputs was still pending. The Bahamas, has submitted replies to questions by Members.

The IGA was informed that the Global Seminar on WTO Accessions would take place in Geneva, from 23 to 27 September.

The 2nd Roundtable of the China and LDCs' Accession Programme would be held in Luang Prabang, Lao PDR, from 15 to 18 October. The Draft Programme was shared with the LDCs Consultative Group briefing of 22 May.

As part of the Accessions Internships Programme, interns from LDCs and developing countries were currently working in the Division.
