# Problems Experienced in the Preparation & Submission of DS- Notifications

- > Absence of dedicated agriculture notification desks at federal and provincial level.
- If there is a desk then Simultaneous functions (agriculture policy & research, SPS NNA and Enquiry point)
- > Non availability of properly trained technical staff & shortage of human resources.
- Procedural matters involving various authorities and decentralization of tasks.

# Problems Experienced in the Preparation & Submission of DS- Notifications

- > Administrative changes in agriculture departments.
- Shared jurisdiction of agriculture at national & provincial level.
- Comprehensive data requirements
- > Delay in the publication of official statistics
- Insufficient & inadequate timeframes provided for submission of notifications- time lag because of different financial years followed by different countries

### Solution-3D APPROACH

- > Dedicated staff with clear responsibility:
- Setting up Specific "WTO UNITS" at National (MinFA, MOC, MOI&P,
   PARC) & Provincial Agriculture and Planning Departments etc.
- Recruitment Of Best Available Technical Staff.
- Delegation Focal points in the Provinces
- Enhanced Coordination With The Federal And Provincial Government
   Agencies In Charge Of Data Collection through WTO UNITS (WAPDA, PASSCO, FBS, NFC, planning commission, TDAP, customs, provincial agriculture extension and marketing services etc).
- Creation Of Informal Coordination System With The Relevant Agencies.
- > Due diligence- standard operating procedures, data varification
- > Timely Dissemination Of Reference Material, On-job Training And Regular Follow Ups.

#### CLEAR APPROACH

- Commitment to the multilateral system
- Leadership translated this commitment to rest of the govternment machinery
- > Efficieny to promote excellence and transparency
- Acknowledgment of capacity gaps and recognition of good work
- Reward by combining institutional development objectives with personal growth

### PRISM

- Principle of transparency must be upheld-emphasize the importance of timely notifications
- Responsibility of the members to fulfil obligations
- Improved information flow and Identification Of Specific Needs Of The Developing Countries Regarding Notification Obligations
- Strengthen Support System through technical assisstance, advisory role of WTO, capacity building programs for developing and least developed countries through ITTC, AGCD etc. to meet Specific Identified Needs.
