



#### **Agricultural Notifications**




### **II. Tariff Rate Quota**

#### Flow Chart for Submission of TRQ Notification (MA:2)




### **III. Special Safeguard Measure (1/2)**

#### Flow Chart for Submission of SSG Notification (MA:3)




### **III. Special Safeguard Measure (2/2)**

### **IV. Difficulties for Notification Submission/Analysis (2/2)**

- 1. Communications needed between related Ministries.
  - Prompt data information.
  - Quick comments on the drafted notifications.
  - Accommodation of different opinions.

**Internal regulation, web information & communication.** 

- 2. Knowledgeable case officers.
  - Familiar with WTO notification requirements.
  - Frequent movement of case officers.


Handbook, training, and WTO enquiry point.

## **V.** Conclusion

- 1. Notification obligations are challenging for developing Members and RAMs.
- 2. Capacity-building and a differential timeframe for developing Members/RAMs are crucial.
- 3. E-training and web-handbook with easy-access and prompt modification are significant for capital-based case officers.
