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
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

Targeted DTRRAs in Action or Planned (globally and in Africa)




Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tadjikistan, Turkmenistan, and **Uzbekistan**: comparative targeted DTRRA («WTO E-commerce **Agreement Readiness»**)



Algeria, Ghana, Sierra Leone (TBC), Tunisia, Zambia: targeted DTRRA* focused on compliance with AfCFTA Digital Trade Protocol














Timor-Leste: targeted DTRRA focused on WTO post-accession (WTO Ecommerce Agreement Readiness) / ASEAN accession, incl. DEFA



Jamaica: targeted DTRRA focusing on **Electronic Transactions and Online Consumer Protection**



ASEAN: targeted DTRRA for monitoring of implementation of selected provisions of the ASEAN E-commerce Agreement (technnological neutrality-protection of personal information/privacy-ODR-online consumer protection).



Targeted DTRRAs in Action or Planned (Targeted AfCFTA DTRRAs – National Regulatory Readiness Assessments for Compliance with AfCFTA Digital Trade DP and its 8 Annexes (step-by-step methodology in the making)

- 1. **Detailed matrix assessing regulatory and policy support to digital trade**, including efforts related to implementation, cross-border cooperation, and interoperability initiatives. *The matrix addresses rules embedded in all the provisions of the Digital Trade Protocol and its 8 Annexes*.
- 2. **Desktop analysis** resulting in narrative reports and color-coded reflections based on the "traffic light" pattern AND **Stakeholder mapping** to identify public and private sector stakeholders responsible for implementing each of the rules embedded in the Protocol (over 30 areas).
- 3. **Stakeholder engagement** to gather additional information and validate the results of the desktop analysis.
- 4. Based on the assessment, **elaboration and stakeholder validation of national roadmaps for domestic reforms** in the digital trade area.
- 5. As appropriate, shaping regional and continental initiatives to support the implementation of the AfCFTA Digital Trade Protocol, using the results obtained from the assessments.
