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

How it all began

Revision of the 1994 WTO Government procurement agreement...finalized on 15 December 2011



How was the report drafted and adopted



What is the report about

1. Enhanced transparency

online publication of measures, use of electronic tools, etc.

2. Reduction of Administrative burdens

e-procurement to simplify and shorten processes, online supplier registration, selfdeclaration compliance, eliminate in-person requirements, multi-use lists

3. Procurement opportunities for SMEs

structure contracts into lots, use joint-biddings und subcontracting, room for SME innovation, require prompt payment, avoid prohibitive costs

- 4. Enhancing the professionalization of procurement entities
 - Guidance for contracting authorities to facilitate SME participation, point of contact for SME, debriefing, partnerships and dialogue with stakeholders, consultation on potential SMEs barriers

Significance of the Report

- Tangible achievement to mark 10-year anniversary revised GPA
- Consolidated and comprehensive (but not exhaustive) list of best practices from all GPA Parties
- Important and useful tool to further promote and facilitate participation of SMEs in government procurement markets
- Dissemination to encourage the use of the best practices
- Some lessons learnt: cooperative spirit and resilience, although different perspectives and policies
