Sanitary and phytosanitary measures



Problem: How do you ensure that your country's consumers are being supplied with food that is safe to eat — "safe" by the standards you consider appropriate? And at the same time, how can you ensure that strict health and safety regulations are not being used as an excuse for protecting domestic producers?

An agreement on how governments can apply food safety and animal and plant health measures (sanitary and phytosanitary or SPS measures) sets out the basic rules in the WTO.

> SPS Notification Submission System

National Notification Authorities can now use the SPS Notification Submission System (SPS NSS) to fill out and submit SPS notifications online.

> SPS Information Management System

a database of WTO information on SPS (Notifications, concerns raised, other documents, enquiry points, etc)

SPS NOTIFICATION SUBMISSION SYSTEM

The SPS NSS allows for more accurate and complete notifications, and a substantial reduction in the time required for the WTO to process and circulate them. The system has been available to Members since 1 June 2011 upon request.

Interested Members are requested to send an e-mail to the Secretariat (spscommittee@wto.org) so that their National Notification Authorities can receive login names and access passwords.

As of 17 September 2015, 66 Members have requested and been given access to the system, and 37 of these have officially submitted notifications via the SPS NSS.

Electronic transmission of unrestricted SPS documents

New Document Alerts on all unrestricted documents related to the SPS Agreement are being sent via e-mail to two different mailing lists. These document alerts are sent when new documents or their translations into English, French or Spanish become available. To receive alerts on all unrestricted SPS documents, INCLUDING NOTIFICATIONS, subscribe to the SPSNOTIFS list. To receive alerts on all SPS documents, EXCLUDING notifications, subscribe to the SPSDOCS list. Documents can be accessed through links in the alert email. You can subscribe to the mailing lists by following the instructions below.

The e-mail address of the computer from which the request was sent will be automatically registered. You must subscribe from the computer address where you wish to receive the documents.

Why SPS IMS?



- Since 1995, SPS Committee has seen:
 - > 19,000 SPS notifications
 - > 2,500 other SPS documents
 - > 390 specific trade concerns
 - Enquiry Point/Notification Authority info changing frequently



What is in the SPS IMS?



- Content of SPS notifications
- Basic info on all SPS-related documents
- Details of all STCs
- Contact information on EPs/NNAs



In what languages is it available?



Interface: English, French, Spanish

Data: English, French, Spanish (as it becomes available)



How does it help Members?



- To undertake searches / prepare reports according to specific needs:
 - o Product- or region-specific searches on **notifications**
 - o Theme-specific searches on Committee documents, e.g. on regionalization
 - o Queries on **specific trade concerns** related to specific Members or products



Why a new SPS IMS?

- In operation since 2007 Outdated technology
- Alignment/harmonization with in-house systems
- Improve user-friendliness and enhance functionalities
 - o Streamlined menus
 - Enhanced and more intuitive search functionalities
 - New statistical and graphing functions
 - Correction of bugs

The SPS Information Management System (SPS IMS) provides access to documents and records relevant under the WTO Agreement on the Application of Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures (the SPS Agreement). For more information on the SPS Agreement, please click here.

The SPS IMS allows users to track information on SPS measures that Member governments have notified to the WTO, specific trade concerns raised in the SPS Committee, SPS-related documents circulated at the WTO, Member governments' SPS Enquiry Points and Notification Authorities, and the membership of the WTO, Codex, IPPC, and the OIE.


The system's structure for searching notifications follows very closely the actual notification types and their formats. For further information on notification procedures and formats agreed upon by the SPS Committee, please click here.

Please click on the desired function from the menu bar on the left. You may wish to undertake a "search", prepare a "custom report", or view one of the "predefined reports". The difference between a search and a custom report is that with a custom report you can decide which fields you wish to see in your search results. You can enter one or more criteria to refine your search. Alternatively, you can browse all records by not specifying any criteria before clicking on the Search button. For free text searches, for example under the "description of content" field of notifications, use quotation marks to find exact matches. For example, entering "avian influenza" will find only those records which contain both terms. You can export all search and custom report results to Excel. Predefined reports provide reference lists regularly circulated by the WTO SPS Secretariat and are available in Word format.


