TEXT OF THE AGREEMENT

For Members which acceded pursuant to Article XII of the Marrakesh Agreement, their respective Protocols of Accession may contain notification obligations in addition to those set out in the WTO Agreements and may govern the deadlines for the submission of their initial notifications.

OVERVIEW OF NOTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

WHAT MUST BE NOTIFIED?

The WTO Agreement on Technical Barriers to Trade (TBT Agreement) seeks to ensure that technical regulations, standards and conformity assessment procedures do not create unnecessary obstacles to trade. The transparency provisions of TBT Agreement aim to promote regulatory dialogue, enhance predictability and reduce unnecessary trade barriers. Notification requirements constitute a core element of the Agreement's transparency framework.

The notification requirements under the TBT Agreement are listed below. It is important to underline that since 1995, the TBT Committee has adopted a series of decisions and recommendations to facilitate the implementation of the Agreement's transparency provisions, including its notification requirements. The compilation of notification formats and corresponding guidelines in <u>G/TBT/GEN/388</u> provides further information on what must be notified and how.

Statement of Implementation (Article 15.2)

This one-time notification, to be updated as necessary, should include information on the overarching legal, regulatory, and administrative framework as well as institutional arrangements put in place to implement the TBT Agreement. For example, it should indicate the entities designated as the TBT Notification Authority and the Enquiry Point.

The TBT Committee has adopted guidelines and a corresponding online format for submitting this statement of implementation as per Article 15.2.²

Technical Regulations and Conformity Assessment Procedures (Articles 2.9, 2.10, 5.6, 5.7)

This notification process ordinarily begins by identifying those measures that should be notified to the WTO. Figure 1 illustrates whether to notify technical regulations and conformity assessment procedures in line with Articles 2.9, 2.10, 5.6 or 5.7 of the TBT Agreement.

The notification should include information on products to be covered as well as on objective and rationale of the measure. In addition, it should provide a comment period (normally 60 days), except in urgent circumstances (Articles <u>2.10.1</u> and <u>5.7.1</u>).

The TBT Committee has adopted specific formats and guidelines for the notification of new measures as well as follow up information related to these measures.³ In addition, the Committee has finalized a good practice guide on how to prepare as well as respond to comments on a TBT notification.⁴

Agreements with other Members (Article 10.7)

Members may reach agreements with other countries on issues related to technical regulations, standards or conformity assessment procedures. These can include mutual recognition agreements, equivalence agreements and other types of regulatory co-operation mechanisms. Whenever these agreements may have a significant effect on trade, they should be notified by one of the Members party to the agreement, indicating the products to be covered and a brief description of the agreement.

The TBT Committee has adopted a specific format for the notification of agreements as per Article 10.7.5

OVERVIEW OF NOTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

Acceptance of the Code of Good Practice on the Preparation, Adoption and Application of Standards (Annex 3, paras. C and J)

Article 4 of the TBT Agreement requires Members to ensure that their central government standardizing bodies accept and comply with the Code of Good Practice on the Preparation, Adoption and Application of Standards (Annex 3). It also requires Members to take such reasonable measures as may be available to them to ensure that local government and non-governmental standardizing bodies within their territories, as well as regional standardizing bodies, of which they or one or more bodies within their territories are Members, accept and comply with this Code of Good Practice.

Standardizing bodies that have accepted (or withdrawn) from the Code of Good Practice must notify this fact to the International Organization for Standardization (ISO). In addition, those bodies that have accepted the Code are required to publish a work programme every six months, and its existence must also be notified to ISO.

The WTO and ISO Secretariats have adopted specific procedures⁶ and formats⁷ for these standards-related notifications, which are also accessible through the <u>WTO ISO Standards</u> <u>Information Gateway</u>.

WHICH MEMBERS MUST NOTIFY?

All WTO Members.

WHEN TO NOTIFY?

Statement of Implementation (Article 15.2)

Upon accession to the WTO. Revisions should be submitted as necessary, for example when there are relevant changes in the overarching regulatory framework or institutional arrangements.

Technical Regulations and Conformity Assessment Procedures (Articles 2.9, 2.10, 5.6, 5.7)

At an early appropriate stage when amendments can still be introduced, and comments taken into account. Figure 2 below indicates the lifecycle of a measure.

Agreements with other Members (Article 10.7)

Whenever a Member has reached agreement with one or more countries on issues related to technical regulations, standards or conformity assessment procedures.

Acceptance of the Code of Good Practice on the Preparation, Adoption and Application of Standards (Annex 3, paras. C and J)

Upon acceptance of the Code of Good Practice.

In addition, information on work programmes should be notified every six months. Alternatively, the website address where work programmes are regularly made available should be provided.

HOW TO NOTIFY?

1. Technical Regulations and Conformity Assessment Procedures; Statements of Implementation; Agreements with other Members



Members can submit their notifications online through the <u>ePing SPS&TBT Platform</u>, using the corresponding notification formats adopted by the Committee.⁸ ePing facilitates coordination among government agencies in the preparation of notifications and helps keep track of notifications submitted by all Members.

To access the notification submission dashboard of ePing, government officials responsible for the preparation and submission of notifications should register on the ePing platform and send a message to <u>ePing@wto.org</u> requesting notification admin rights. A notification admin can, in addition to submitting notifications, also grant notification drafting rights and/ or submission rights to other domestic users and update Enquiry Point contact details. Users that already have a WTO account can use these credentials to register on the site and benefit from the single sign-in across WTO websites. Questions and queries on the ePing SPS&TBT Platform can be sent to the WTO Secretariat (<u>ePing@wto.org</u>).

2. Acceptance of the Code of Good Practice on the Preparation, Adoption and Application of Standards (Annex 3, paras. C and J)

Standards-related notifications need to be submitted to the ISO via email (tbtcode@iso.org). The notification formats for acceptance (Form A), withdrawal (Form B) and work programmes (Form C) can be downloaded through the <a href="https://www.wto.uc.edu/wto.uc

Acceptance and withdrawal notifications are subsequently circulated by the WTO Secretariat. These notifications can be consulted under the Facts & figures **tab** on ePing in each Members' profile page.

When Members submit notifications online through the ePing platform, the Central Registry of Notifications (CRN) is the first point of contact as indicated in document Wt/INF/25/Rev.2. While Members can also submit notifications by email to the Central Registry of Notifications (CRN) (crn@wto.org), there is a significantly longer circulation delay as these have to be processed manually by the WTO Secretariat. Notification templates can be downloaded from the TBT Transparency toolkit.
