A world where cross-border trade is simple, fast, and cost-effective.



RESULTS - COLOMBIA RISK MANAGEMENT



We worked with Colombia's National Food and Drug Surveillance Institute and the business community to introduce a risk-management system for food, beverages, medicines and medical devices.



RESULTS - COLOMBIA ADVANCE RULINGS



The Alliance worked with the Colombian Customs and Tax Administration (DIAN) and the private sector to create a Center of Excellence to provide consistency in how customs classifies and treats automotive parts.

The Center has become a virtual hub for specialised automotive industry knowledge within DIAN. By centralising and harmonising decision-making on an industry-specific basis, it has created a more fluid and operational relationship between the public and private sectors.



- 70 days average reduction in processing and approval time
- Increased predictability and harmonisation

Está concebido para simplificar y armonizar los procedimientos aduaneros con el fin de dar cumplimiento a los lineamientos establecidos en el Acuerdo sobre Facilitación del Comercio - AFC, de la Organización Mundial de Aduanas - OMA, y en el marco de los Acuerdos de Libre Comercio.



COLOMBIA – IN PROGRESS RISK MANAGEMENT, ePHYTO




We are working with the Colombian Institute of Agriculture (ICA) and private sector stakeholders to:

- introduce electronic phytosanitary certificates (ePhytos)


