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Recent projects include the use of Machine Learning and Artificial Intelligence for enhanced patient risk stratification in Estonia, GIS-based optimal placement of health facilities and services in Peru, and hospitals' quality metrics in India. He has also been working with innovative survey data such as standardized patients, medical vignettes and direct observations to measure the quality of health services. His research has been published in prestigious journals in economics and public health. He obtained his BA in Economics and Spanish from Middlebury College, and MA and PhD in Economics from University of Michigan.
