CONTEXT

- •Brazilian Government's G20 Priorities: Emphasis on social inclusion and economic empowerment.
- The study "Women in Foreign Trade: An Analysis for Brazil", conducted by the Foreign Trade Secretariat, revelaed for the first time how women are represented in the corporate structure of Brazilian companies that engage in international trade.
- •Launch of 'Elas Exportam': A national mentorship program to empower women exporters through capacity-building and access to networks.
- •Brazil's accession to the Global Trade and Gender Arrangement

- Strategic Partnerships
- ✓ Engagement with International Organizations: ITC and OECD
- ✓ Collaboration with the B20 to amplify private sector engagement: Workshop and Survey to identify challenges faced by women entrepreneurs in accessing international markets.

SURVEY RESULTS

- Participation: 1900+ respondents, including women and men from businesses across G20 members and invited countries.
- Challenges identified in 5 areas :
 - ➤ Nature of Business
 - > Access to Information
 - > Access to Business Opportunities
 - Access to Financing
 - ➤ Compliance with Customs Procedures and Regulations

BUILDING THE G20 COMPENDIUM OF GOOD PRACTICES TO INCREASE THE PARTICIPATION OF WOMEN IN INTERNATIONAL TRADE

- Objective: To share experiences and to document good and innovative actions.
- Survey Insights: Highlighted systemic barriers and key areas for intervention.

 - Challenges addressed
 - Description
 - Lessons learned and results achieved
 - > References

OUTCOMES

- **Pioneering Priority in the G20**: Women's participation in trade addressed as a stand-alone workstream in the trade and investment track of the G20.
- **Complementary Efforts**: Broad and representative efforts involving governments, international organizations, the private sector, and civil society.
- **G20 Compendium of Good Practices**: A collection of good practices that can serve as a reference for the shaping of new initiatives.

- Importance of gender disaggregated data to inform trade policy design, implementation, review and revision
- Role of **monitoring mechanisms** in promoting women-inclusive trade policies.
